He built relationships with a team of engineers from Malaysia representing Dunham -Bush to revise their design (DRAWINGS THEY PRODUCED ALL IN METRIC) and produce a streamlined plan that guided the team through every critical detail, defending the concerns he uncovered that needed altering to provide a test facility that would effectively suit their needs.

Once all parties involved were in agreement on the final draft, Luis Jimenez handled the Project management tasks. His attention to logistics and manpower maintained constant momentum and accurately monitoring profitability.
